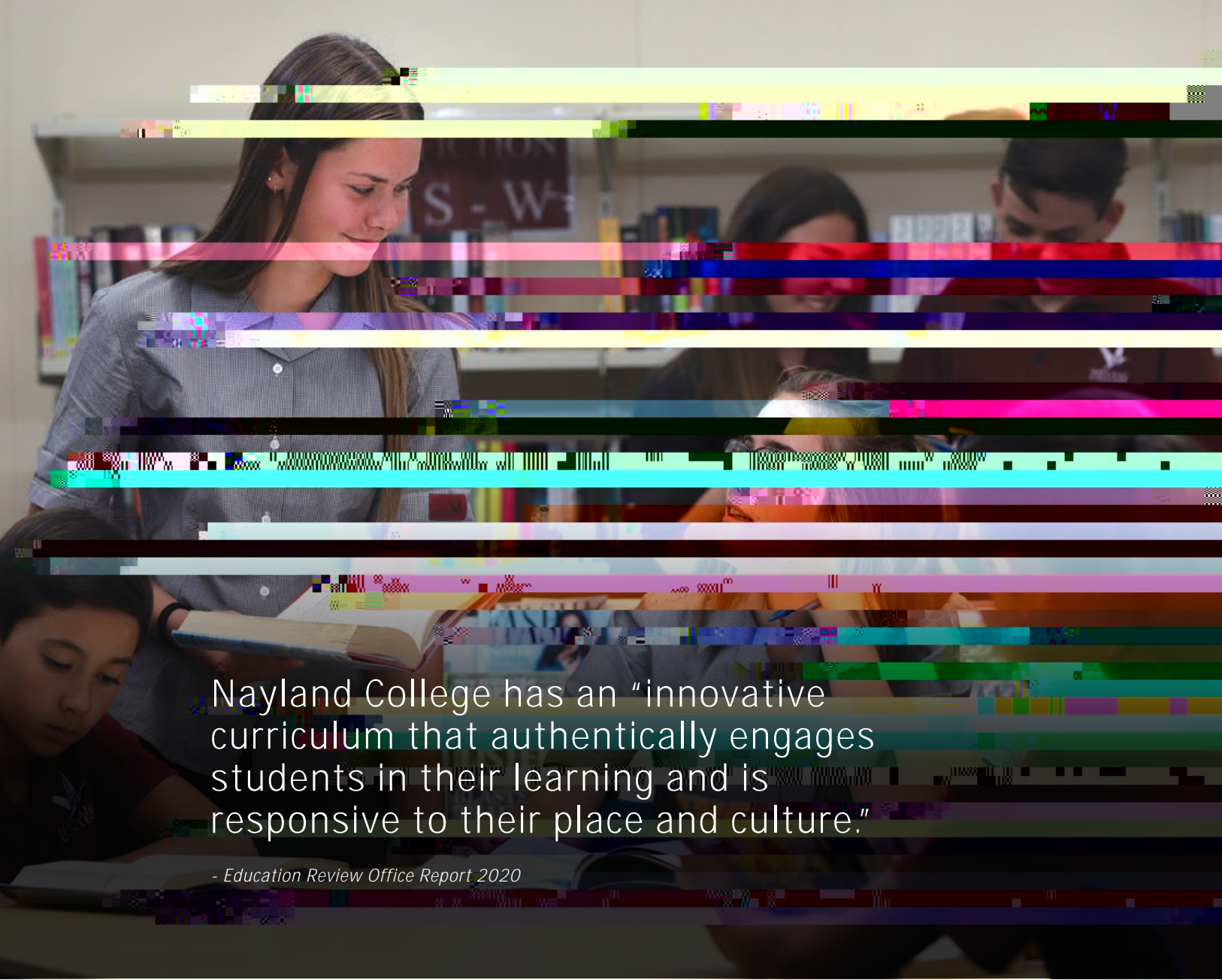

Values-based education

Nayland College runs a relational, values-based positive behaviour system. We have extremely high expectations and standards of behaviour, backed up by a positive reinforcement system that values the good learning choices made by students. Our attendance systems are designed to promote and ensure that all students are in class, on time, all the time.

Success – learners who aim for personal excellence

Opportunity – learners who take every opportunity to reach their goals

Ako – learners who are engaged, collaborative and curious

Respect – learners who show manaaki (respect and concern for learning, for others, for themselves and for the environment) and whanaungatanga (connection and belonging)

Junior learning programme

Year 9 and 10 students study the essential learning areas of English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, Art, Health and Physical Education and Technology. Particular emphasis is placed on literacy, numeracy and digital technology capabilities.

Year 9 students learn these essential subjects in core classes, while Year 10 students have the opportunity to choose from a range of core modules available across the curriculum.

In addition to the core curriculum, we offer an exciting range of challenging and enjoyable modules which ensure a well-balanced programme offering students a sound basis from which to make their subject choices as they move into the senior school.

Senior learning programme

Students in Years 11, 12 and 13 can study a wide range of specialised NCEA courses that build on and extend their learning across the eight learning areas. Students choose a course of study based on their interests, abilities and their future career direction.

Enrichment

At Nayland College we offer an enrichment programme that supports students to excel in their individual areas of giftedness and talent. Our programme is broad and allows students to pursue their passions and excel in their strengths. Specific enrichment modules enable students to develop and hone their knowledge and skills in the areas that best align to their strengths, whether that is academic, cultural, sporting, musical, artistic, social or leadership based. Tutorials

Weekly tutorials for a wide range of subjects are open to all students throughout the year. Regular tutorials offer the chance for students to consolidate learning, revise for assessments or catch up after absences.

Learning support

An extensive range of strategies are provided for students with additional learning needs. These include reader-writer assistance, specialised classes, one-to-one support and assistive technologies.

Institute of Sport (IOS)

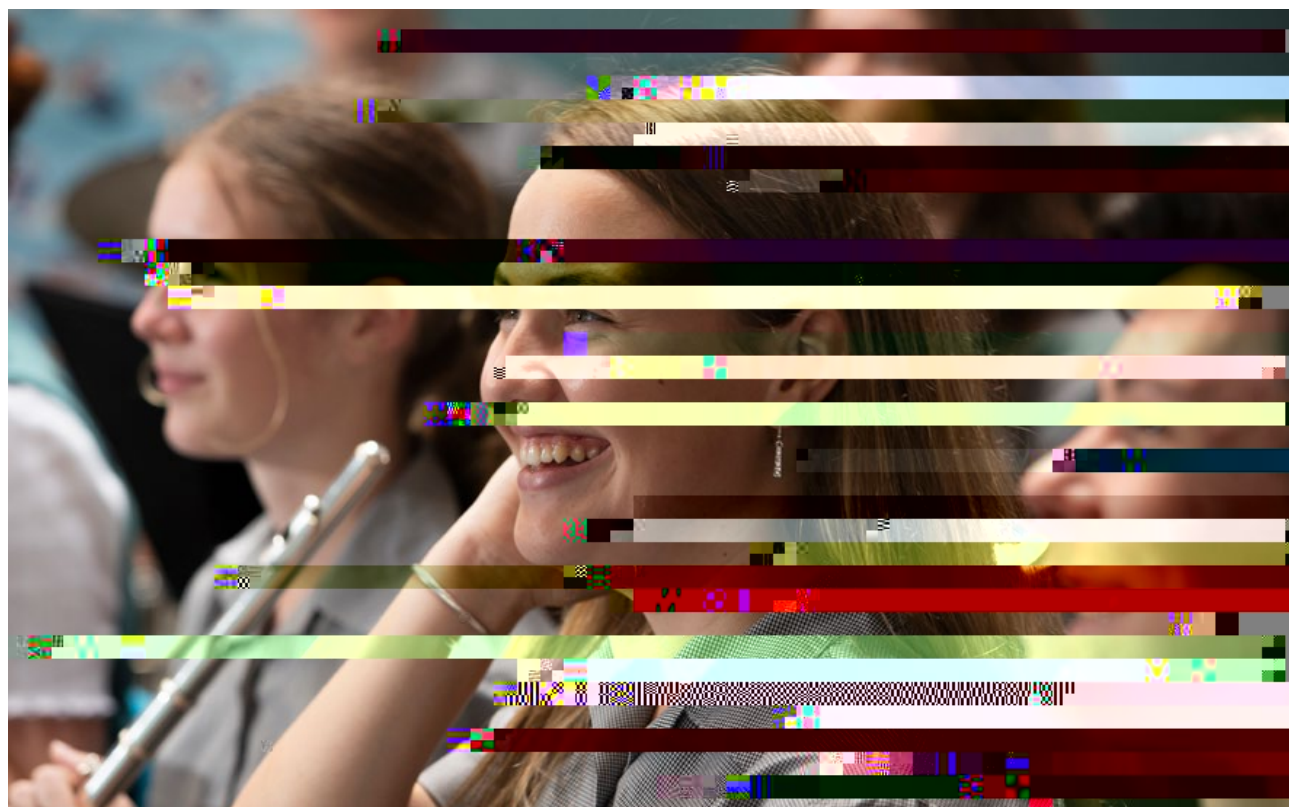

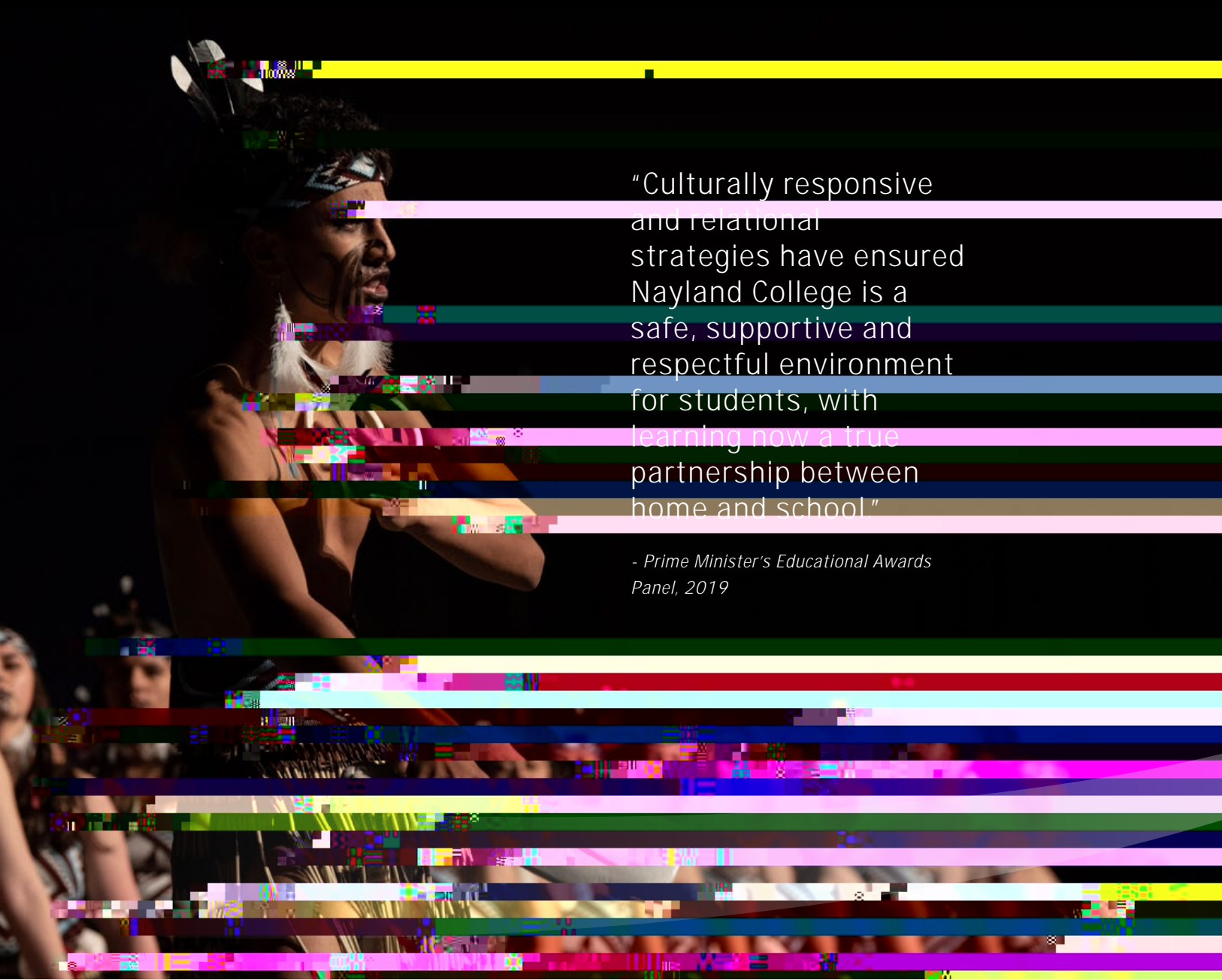
Specialist music programmes

We have several music modules offered at Year 9, catering for a variety of musical experience and interests. With specialist tutors, regular ensembles and highly qualified staff, our junior music programmes effectively prepare students to study NCEA music as well as offering opportunities for students to extend their talents beyond the classroom.

Foundational Skills programme

Nayland College offers a unique 60-credit course with an additional qualification of a 'New Zealand Certificate in Foundation Skills Level 1'. The purpose of this course is to support students with learning skills which focus and enhance their knowledge, build confidence in learning and develop some key skills such as leadership, resiliency, and self-management. Students either continue into Level 2 or transfer these skills into the work force or apprenticeship programmes.

Cultural opportunities

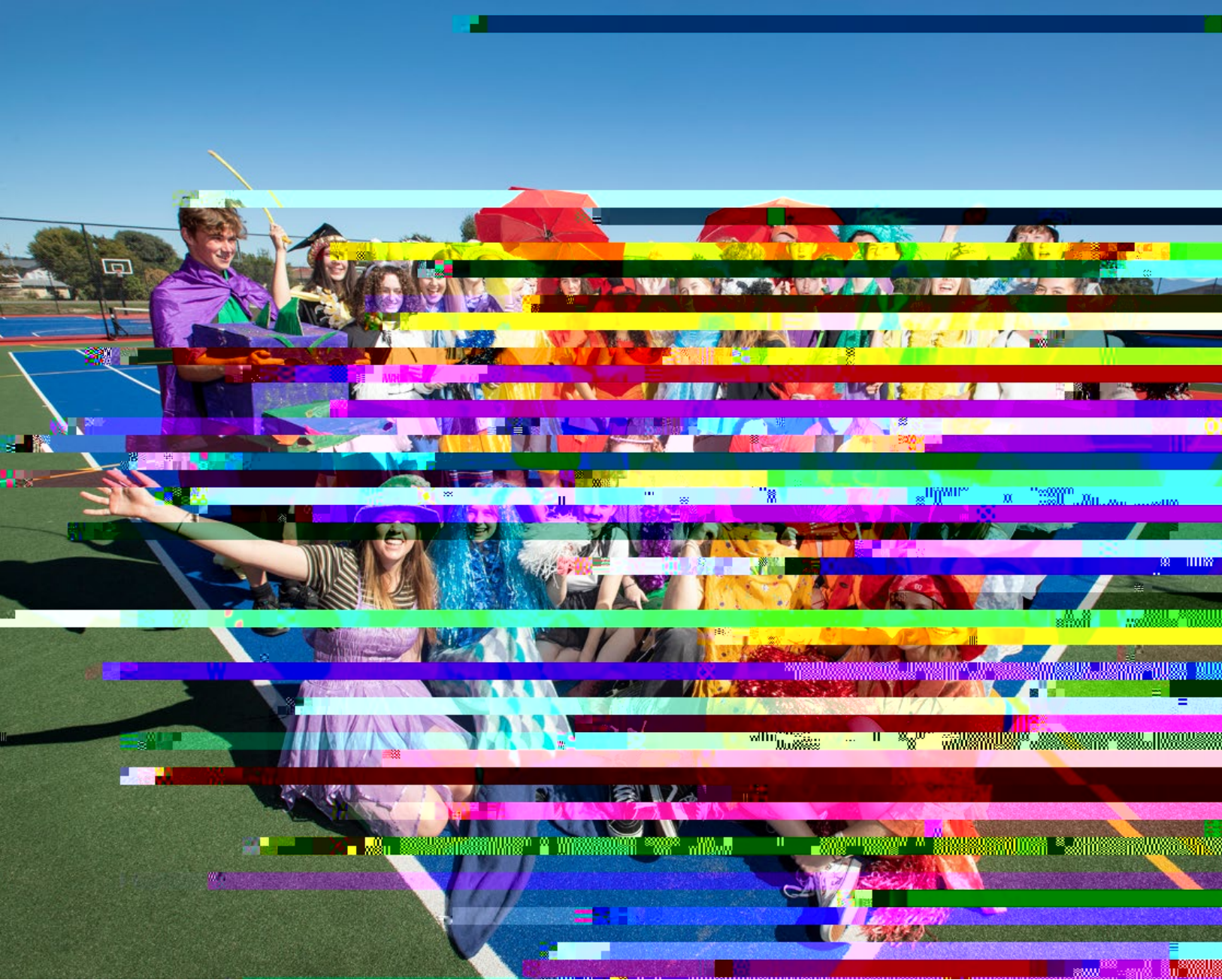

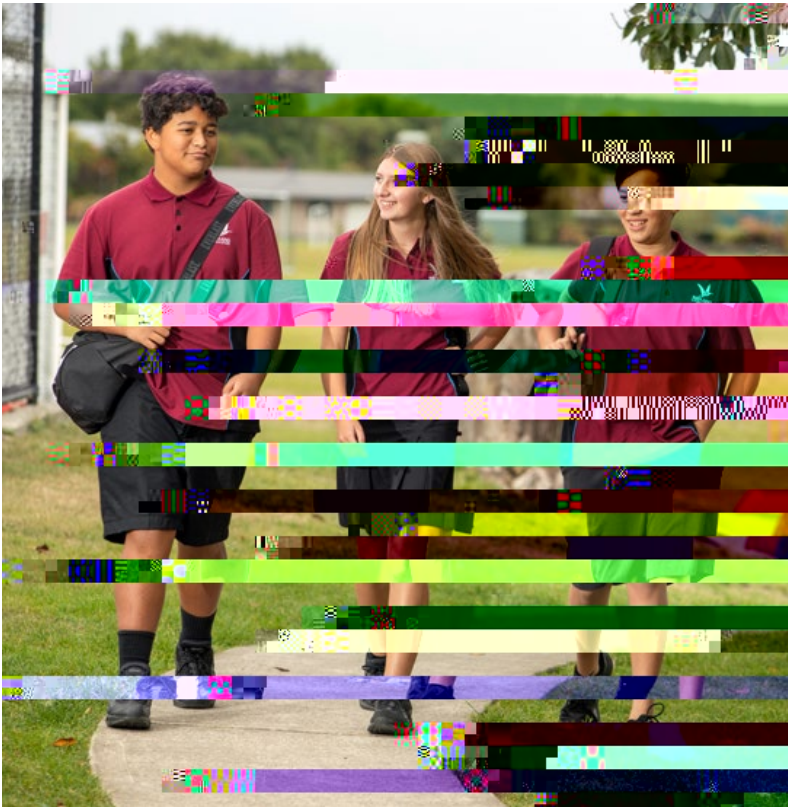

Student support

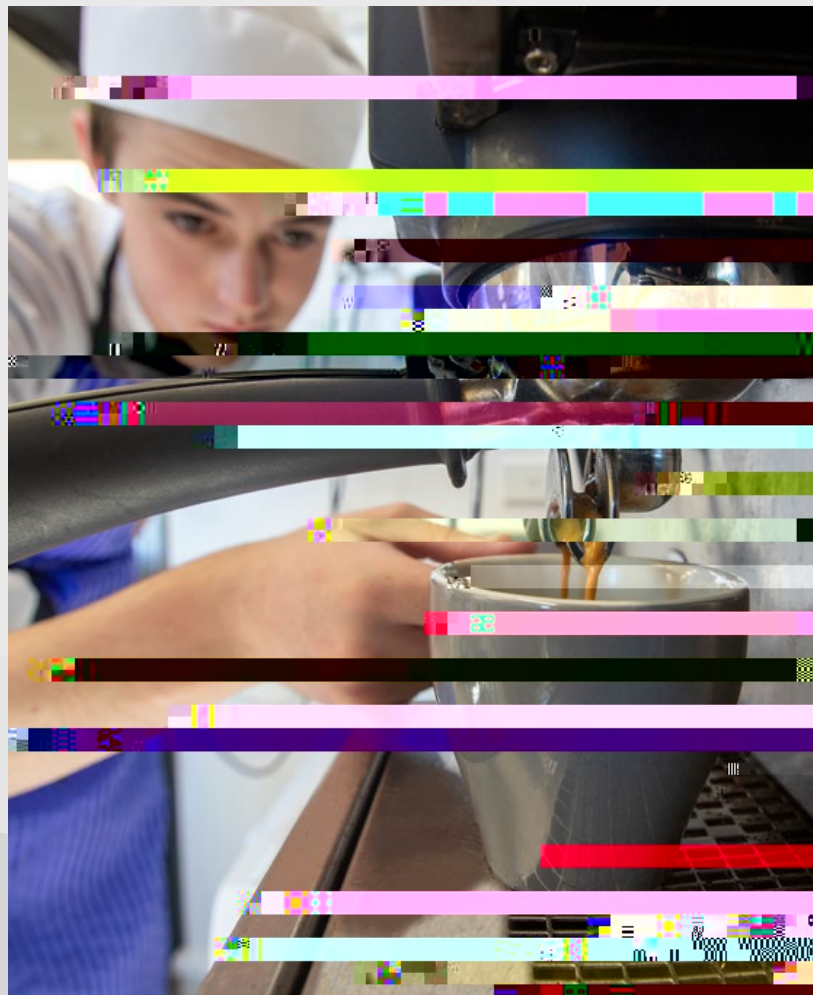

Trades Academy

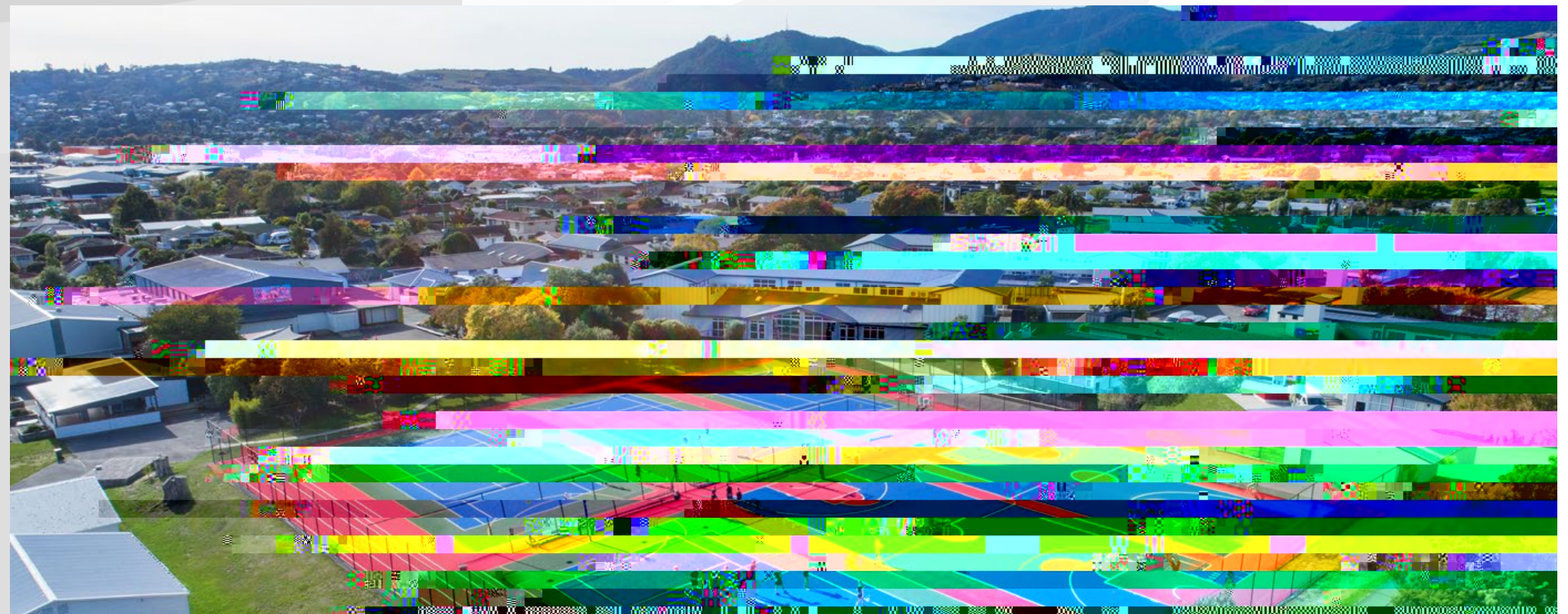

Tertiary study preparation and scholarships

Our Careers Centre provides a central location for students seeking information about tertiary education. This includes support to gain entry to universities and halls of residence, as well as applications for study scholarships to New Zealand and overseas universities.

Future focused facilities

Along with a high-performance, multi-sport turf and specialised performance arts centre, Nayland College has one of the largest Primary Industry facilities in the region with large numbers of students engaged in a variety of junior and senior programmes. The installation of a full commercial kitchen has enabled Nayland College to offer higher level hospitality credits and our technology workshops create opportunities for students to excel across a number of subjects. Nayland College is committed to providing state of the art facilities to effectively prepare students for successful careers in our modern and ever changing world. This includes our new Cultural Centre, Te Puna Manako, opened in 2023.

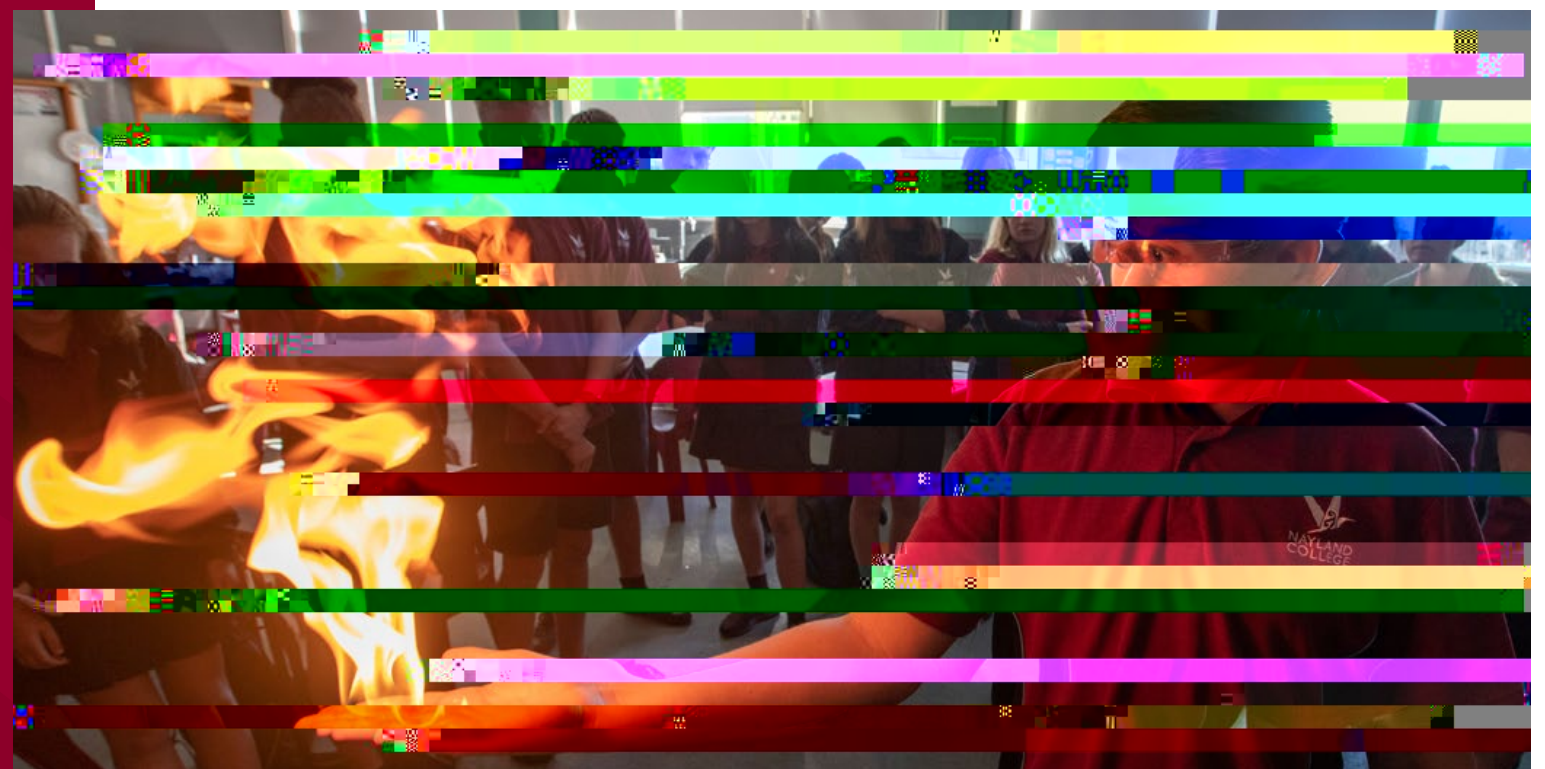
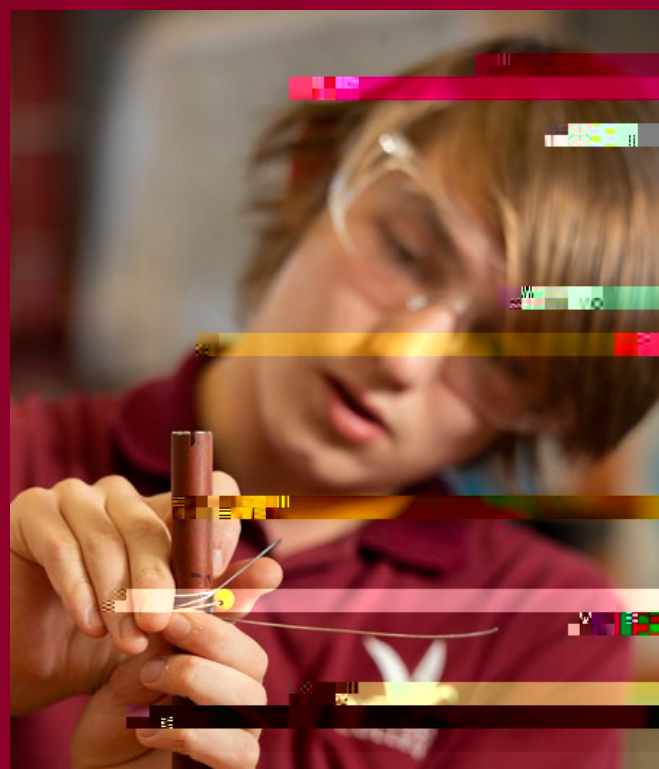
Our vision
